VALIDATION

& TAG-IN: Saturday, October 24, 2020 from 8:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m.
ENTRIES DUE: All entries must be submitted online by January 28, 2021. Entry fees are to be turned into your 4-H Leader or Ag Teacher
ENTRY FEE: \$30.00
CHECK-IN: Tuesday, April 20, 2021 from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.
WEIGH-IN TIME: Scales will be open immediately after check-in is closed.
Weight Cards must be submitted to the check-in table no later than 11:30 a.m. on Tuesday, April 20, 2021
JUDGING: Tuesday, April 20, 2021 at 6:00 p.m.

Livestock Barn Cattle Chute

1. All entries for this division will be subject to the General Livestock Rules of the Galveston County Fair & Rodeo, Inc. except where they conflict with the requirements of this division in which case the division rules will prevail. In the event of special circumstances that may arise, or a conflict between rules, decisions of the Show Chairperson and the Livestock Superintendent will be final.
2. **COUNTY STEERS ONLY:** Verification Process:
 - a) Exhibitor must locate his/her steer within Galveston County.
 - b) At the time of verification, calf must be seen with mother and be county ear-tagged by the Steer Committee before exhibitor may take possession.
 - c) Calves must be born in Galveston County and will require verification by the Steer Committee.
 - d) County calves must be county tagged prior to Validation & Tag In.
3. All steers must be presented for validation and/or ear tagging on Saturday, October 24, 2020, from 8:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. at the Fairgrounds. All steers must be owned by the Exhibitor on this date. Exhibitors must declare whether to show in the County Division or the Market Division on this date. The **County Division** validation process will consist of a) verification of ear-tag, b) nose printing, c) classifying, and d) signing of validation form by exhibitor and parent/guardian or representative. The **Market Division** validation process will consist of a) ear-tagging, b) nose printing, c) classifying, and d) signing of validation form by exhibitor and parent/guardian or representative.
4. Steers which are tagged with an Official Texas Steer Tag approved by the Texas Agriculture Extension Service and which are the property of the same Exhibitor (as indicated on the official state 4-H or FFA steer validation forms), will not be required for re-tagging. However, all such steers must be present for recording of the Texas Tag Number, nose printing, classifying, and signing of validation form by exhibitor and parent/guardian or representative. **County Division: If tags have been removed for Texas tag, the original County tag must be presented with the steer at tag-in. (Also see General Rule #11)**
5. The Classifier will be a non-Galveston County Cattleman chosen and approved by the Steer Committee, who will determine the steer on visible characteristics only to be either:

AMERICAN: BRAHAM CHARACTERISTICS AND FEATURES MUST BE EXHIBITED, MUST EXHIBIT AT LEAST THREE (3) OF THESE CHARACTERISTICS: DEWLAP, EAR, HUMP, OR SHEATH.

EXOTIC: ALL OTHERS.

The decision of the Classifier at validation and tag-in will be final.

6. An Exhibitor may enter two steers in the County Steer Division and two steers in the Market Steer Division provided one is exhibited in an American class and one is exhibited in an Exotic Class. Entries must be submitted online by January 28, 2021. Further instructions will be sent to your 4-H Leader/Ag Teacher when these forms become available. All Exhibitors will turn in the entry fees to the 4-H Leader/Ag Teacher of the club/chapter that they will be exhibiting under.
7. For safety reasons, all steers must be de-horned prior to check-in.
8. NO CLIPPING on steers (electric or manual, scissors, razors, knife, etc.) will be allowed once steers are on the Galveston County Fair & Rodeo, Inc., grounds. No blowers allowed. All steers will be slick sheared to have no more than 1/4" of hair on any part of the animal's body upon arrival to show grounds. The only exception will be the tail switch. The switch may be ratted and balled or may be bobbed off. Steers will be checked at the time of check-in for conformity of the slick shear 1/4" or less of hair. All grooming of your cattle before the show must be done in the designated grooming area only.
9. **Steers must weigh a minimum of one thousand (1000) pounds on check-in day at the Fair. All Steers will be weighed by the exhibitor on the designated scales provided by the Steer Committee. Each exhibitor must return the weight card to the official check-in table no later than 11:30am on Tuesday, April 20, 2021. The weight card is the INDIVIDUAL OFFICIAL WEIGHT. Once the weight card is turned in, absolutely no changes can be made. NO EXCEPTIONS.**
10. Steers must be halter broke for the Fair and cross-tied with one rope around the neck and one rope from the halter. Any steer which cannot be handled by the Exhibitor during check-in will automatically be sifted. Any steer which cannot be handled by the Exhibitor during judging will be removed from the Show Ring and disqualified.
11. No hay for bedding will be allowed. Shavings will be permitted at exhibitors' expense, but not provided by GCF & R. Exhibitors' shavings cannot be stored on the fairgrounds.
12. Stall area for steers must be cleaned by the exhibitor prior to their release. NO steers will be released until the stall area has been inspected.
13. No steer may be shown that has been artificially filled with any amount of liquid at any time, once the steer enters the grounds of the show. The only exception will be a medical problem, such as dehydration, bloat, etc. where a veterinarian will be consulted by the Livestock Superintendent or Show Chairperson at the owner's expense. The Livestock Superintendent or Show Chairperson must be present when the veterinarian's recommended treatment is administered.
14. Steers will be placed into American or Exotic classes of equal or near equal numbers, according to weight. The number of classes will be determined by the Steer Committee according to the number of entries at check-in.
15. Only the exhibitor, steer & one (1) parent or Ag/4H leader will be allowed in the designated holding area during the show.
16. There will be an American and an Exotic Champion and Reserve Champion in both the County Division and the Market Division. The County American and County Exotic Champions will compete against the Market American and Market Exotic Champions for the Overall Grand and Reserve Champion Steer in the 2021 Steer Show.
17. Immediately following each class, the top three steers will be re-weighed. Animals having more than a maximum weight gain of five percent (5%) over the official weight at check-in will be sifted and disqualified.
18. A Proof of Delivery Form (when applicable) and thank you card (see General Rule #44) will be required before Exhibitor's check can be released. All exhibitors must come to the Fair Office, with these items, to sign for their check.
19. **ALL JR AUCTION AND COMMITMENT ANIMALS GOING TO THE PACKING HOUSE MUST BE RETURNED TO THE FAIRGROUNDS ON SATURDAY, MAY 1, 2021, AT THE DESIGNATED TIME.**
